1 Corinthians 15:55-57

Romans 3:23-24

Easter Sunday has just past, the celebration of the empty tomb. That empty tomb is what takes away the sting of death and replaces it with eternal life.

But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept. For since by man came death, by man came also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive.
1 Corinthians 15:20-22

Never again do we need to fear the sting of death. Nothing can take us from our eternal life.


