And it came to pass in the days of Amraphel king of Shinar, Arioch king of Ellasar, Chedorlaomer king of Elam, and Tidal king of nations; That these made war with Bera king of Sodom, and with Birsha king of Gomorrah, Shinab king of Admah, and Shemeber king of Zeboiim, and the king of Bela, which is Zoar. OK...so now we know the problem. What good is a problem without a resolution? The solution is something I have said time and time again...wait for it... wait for it...PRAYER!

How do we know that prayer is what we are to do? Because, it's what works and it is what we are directed to do.

I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time. 1 Timothy 2:1-6

Members in all levels of government can be subjects of corruption and unrighteousness, that doesn't mean they all are. It also doesn't mean that they can't be redeemed. It is only through prayer that we are all redeemed, through prayers of our own and through prayers of intercession by others. (God knows my mother prayed for my redemption for years!)

Now mine eyes shall be open, and mine ears attend unto the prayer that is made in this place. 2 Chronicles 7:14-15
